

World Vision

Established in **1950**, World Vision International is a **child-focused** relief, development and advocacy organization that adheres to the belief of “**servicing the poor**” and works with various parties to commit to serve the most vulnerable children, their families and communities. World Vision is currently working in over **90** countries and regions across the world with about **37,000** employees.

World Vision China

In 1993, World Vision China was established to carry out a wide variety of work on poverty alleviation and community development. All World Vision China projects are initiated through close partnership with local governments at all levels and received their full support.

In 2019, World Vision China operated 29 Child-focused Area Programs that directly benefited **54,981** sponsored children, let children living out lives of fullness and served **2,406,971** people in China.

World Vision actively observes with the *Law on Administration of Activities of Overseas Non-governmental Organizations in the Mainland China* and has completed registration of 8 representative offices in Guangdong, Yunnan, Guizhou, Jiangxi, Tianjin, Guangxi, Shaanxi and Hebei. In 2019, our total expenditure is RMB **109,875,178** (USD **1,573** million) for projects. Funding is supported by World Vision offices worldwide, of which over 60% is raised from the Hong Kong public who donates regularly each month. Their trust of World Vision is built upon our diligent annual internal and external audits, as well as careful selection of projects.

Our Promise 2030 will bring brighter future for the world's most vulnerable children

On May 27, 2019, 10 departments, including the Ministry of Civil Affairs, the Ministry of Education, the Ministry of Public Security, the Ministry of Justice, and the Ministry of Finance, issued the "Opinions on Further Improving the Care System for Left-behind Children and Children in Difficulties". The "Opinions" stated the overall requirements for strengthening the construction of child work teams at grassroots; clarified the work pattern of child care services participated by multiple parties; and put forward the specific requirements for strengthening the construction of the care system for rural left-behind children and children in difficulties in poverty-stricken areas.

For nearly 70 years, World Vision has served millions of children, their families and communities globally. "Our Promise 2030" global strategy will enhance World Vision's commitment to vulnerable children. It will pool resources to provide proper care and services for vulnerable children so as to build brighter future for them.

"It Takes a World to End Domestic Violence Against Children" campaign launched

In November 2018, World Vision China launched its five-year campaign, It Takes a World to End Domestic Violence Against Children, on-line. It joined hands with all sectors from the society to expose the community with heightened awareness of anti-domestic violence, resort to media and business partners to spread messages and build the capacity of anti-domestic violence practitioners who can provide professional service and support for victims.

In its area development areas nationwide, World Vision China conducted publicity and education of *Anti-domestic Violence Law*, held positive family education training as well as parent-child activities. 10,183 children and 12,133 parents attended relevant activities with increased awareness against domestic violence and of taking initiatives to report child protection incidents and improved family relation. 299 children had dialogue with adults regarding family violence and child-parent relation and proposed suggestion to schools and relevant policy makers.

In cooperation with Beijing Zhongke Psychological Assistance Center, Shenzhen Pengxing Anti-Domestic Violence Center, and Shaanxi Research Association for Women and Family, World Vision has organized anti-domestic violence advanced training and capacity building training for social organizations in Shenzhen City and Xi'an City this year, which benefited 163 social organization staff. The training has improved the sensitivity of social organizations against domestic violence and the service skills of their staff, and would help them to go deep into the community to carry out various publicity and education activities to prevent domestic violence, thus promoting the construction of a "Zero Tolerance for Violence" community support environment.

Walking Together With One Heart for Children Project

In order to further promote the construction of grassroots children's welfare and protection system, World Vision has cooperated with the China Philanthropy Research Institute of Beijing Normal University, Yang County Civil Affairs Bureau and Longchuan County Civil Affairs Bureau to launch a three-year Walking Together With One Heart for Children Project in Yang County, Shaanxi Province and Longchuan County, Yunnan Province. At present, we have already established and opened 25 children's homes in village committees, set up village-level child welfare directors, initially developed a "county-township-village" three-level child welfare and protection service mechanism, and established a child service network, which improved the quality of life of children and promoted the protection of children's rights and the development of children's social welfare.

Guangdong West Vulnerable Children Caring Project

World Vision works with 16 social work stations at Guangdong West Vulnerable Children Caring Project. The project aims to establish caring and protective communities for children, enhance community members' awareness as well as knowledge of child protection, and develop children's life skill. Project activities in this year mainly include improvement of safe space for children, enhancement of child protection capacity, development of children's life skills, support vulnerable children and training of practical skills in community children's work. More than 9,000 children benefited from the project.

Warm Children's Home

When Xiaoshitou was one-year-old, his parents left home to take migrant work out of the village, and he was taken care of by his grandparents aged nearly 70. When his grandparents were doing farm work, he was playing mud in the field. Because no one could teach him to write at home, Xiaoshitou was boarding at kindergarten when he was in senior grade.

When I first saw Xiaoshitou, he was very cautious, his head lowered, his small mouth closed tightly, and his two small hands were nervously held together. When people spoke to him, he immediately lowered his head when his eyes met others for only one second as if he was a little pitiful.

When Xiaoshitou was in the 2nd grade of primary school, World Vision set up a children's home in the village. Auntie Li was a child worker in the village. After learning about Xiaoshitou's situation during household interview, she invited him to attend activities in the children's home. She cared about his study and life, and used her own mobile phone to help Xiaoshitou make video chat with his parents. The once incommunicative Xiaoshitou has become more and more cheerful gradually and made many new friends in children's home. When she heard that Xiaoshitou's performance in Chinese is not good, Li planned to recommend some books in children's home to him to help him improve his performance through reading.

"Xiaoshitou used to watch TV on weekends. Now he is watching TV less and becomes more polite, and sometimes, he will say hello first to others. He always goes to the children's home whenever it is open. We also feel relieved about this," said Xiaoshitou's grandpa.

"I will make children feel the warmth of home at children's home with the greatest enthusiasm and patience," Li said emotionally at a regular working meeting of child workers.

Since 2018, World Vision has started to cooperate with the China Philanthropy Research Institute of Beijing Normal University to implement Walking Together With One Heart for Children in 15 project villages that have children's homes. There are many child workers like Auntie Li who provides services for Xiaoshitou. They will enrich the lives of children with a vision, a mission, and unlimited love.

With the development of the economy and the acceleration of the urbanization process, more and more people have flowed into large and medium-sized cities, the cities are too overloaded to satisfy the needs of such large a migrant population and as a consequence, the problems faced by migrant children have become increasingly prominent.

Together with its partners, World Vision has launched a migrant child protection project in Yunnan Province, Guangdong Province, Shaanxi Province and Guangxi Zhuang Autonomous Region. The project components mainly include child protection knowledge and capacity building training and life skills education courses to help children learn to protect themselves and establish positive values; equip schools with books and reading facilities while conducting reading promotion activities, organize school teachers to carry out interactive teaching training, and organize adolescent thematic class activities so as to expand children's knowledge, effectively reduce school bullying. In addition, the project has supported local professional partners to develop community child protection brochures, and cooperated with government departments and social organizations to conduct systematic child protection professional skills capacity building training for child protection related persons so as to promote the improvement of related service mechanisms and make better response to the needs of child protection.

The implementation of the project activities has enabled migrant children to have access to appropriate family and community support networks. The project has benefited more than 8,500 people this year:

The Boy Who Put Down His Guard

Tao is from Sichuan Province, who moved to Foshan City with his father and stepmother. He is a lively and energetic boy and it seems inevitable for him to cause troubles in school. However, having conflicts with teachers in the class, and threatening the classmate by an attack with hard objects is really a big "trouble" already. When social worker Missy He first came to the school, Tao was just like this.

At that moment, Tao was in the 5th grade. He had tense relations with his classmates, and even believed that violence must be met by violence. Since the third grade, he has been blackmailed and bullied by senior students after class, and his sense of insecurity was more and more intensified. He began to look for senior students to help revenge those who bullied him, he would also bully the students at the same grade. He acted just like a hedgehog to points all his spines outwards and threaten people who touch him with violence. He was alienated from his teachers and classmates because of this. He once confided to social worker Missy He, "No one likes me in the class, they all want me to leave the school."

After learning about Tao's situation, Missy He started to help Tao reintegrate into the big family of the school. She offered chat with Tao and listened to his troubles, invited him to assist the social worker station to prepare and carry out activities so as to improve his sense of self-identity, and she also invited him to take part in the networking group activities to enhance his social skills. After the activities one after another, Missy He found that he is much more active than before, his mental defense has been removed a lot obviously, and he has become gentle all over.

Now, Tao who's in 6th grade can get along peacefully and happily with his friends in activities. During a group activity of improvisational story generation, he even stepped out to be the first to tell a story. His story was so vivid and interesting, which has won the hearts of the audience and attracted all the attention of the group members.

Special Children's Caring Project



World Vision has been always paying attention to the development of vulnerable children. In "Our Promise 2030" global strategy, it was proposed to strengthen the commitment to the most vulnerable children, including children affected by disabilities.

To protect the well-being of children and adolescents affected by disabilities, World Vision cooperated with Xi'an Lianhu District Charity Association, Yulin Charity Association, Tianjin Wuqing Prince of Peace Children's Home, and Tianjin Wuqing Children's Rehabilitation Center to provide rehabilitation subsidies for 264 disabled children to receive sustained rehabilitation and education services in Xi'an, Yulin and Tianjin cities. After nearly one year of rehabilitation training, 90% of children have improved their sports, self-care, social and language skills. World Vision supported the institutions with disabled children to organize learning of professional rehabilitation methods for different disabilities and stages to enhance the professional competence of the institution, including accessible reading, Auditory Verbal Therapy, Augmentative and Alternative Communication "AAC", etc., World Vision also promoted child primary care givers to participate in community integration activities, parent-child reading training, child protection and child sex education, etc. to help them have a correct understanding of children with disabilities.

In addition, World Vision launched programs of "Rehabilitation and Education of Disabled Orphans" and "Community-based Inclusive Development for Children with Disabilities" in Guangxi Zhuang Autonomous Region, through funding the rehabilitation, education, daily care expenses of children in children's homes and the rehabilitation training and education guidance costs for children with disabilities to help more disabled children, especially those in remote areas, be able to develop their potential through rehabilitation and education and increase their opportunities to be integrated into society. At the same time, the facilitation and training activities organized by World Vision for rehabilitation instructors and social workers were closely linked and enhanced the partners' capacity for providing rehabilitation, education and life integrated services for disabled children, thus further responding to the development needs of disabled children in the program area. World Vision also supported partners to carry out advocacy activities on educational rights of disabled children and inclusive education. The programs benefited more than 2,800 children.

Make Persistent Efforts

12-years-old Weiwei with Down's Syndrome had never reached the standard of the self-care evaluation that she usually needed help from child-care takers to take a bath and pick clothes to wear. However, her serious study attitude made a strong impression on teachers. With the recommendation of the teachers, she entered the Older Children's Life Skills Training Base to start studying and living there.

After one year in the training base, Weiwei tried hard to keep up with the training with her strong will and hard-working. She even became the best for cleaning work of baking class. She worked really hard whenever she did cleaning and her work result was recognized by teachers.

Weiwei's ability of life skills has been greatly enhanced that she is able to take a bath and clean her room herself. Through laundry class, Weiwei learned how to wash clothes by wash machines and how to hang clothes orderly for drying; through hotel class, Weiwei learned the basic process to clean glass, sinks and towel shelves and could do it well with the tips of teachers.

Because of her congenital disorder, Weiwei's unclear pronunciation has been the barrier to communication. She often responds to people in a loud voice when they cannot understand what she said which weakened her relationship with others. However, children have been gradually familiar with each other in the base. Weiwei often talked to other children so they could interpret her words when teacher didn't hear her clearly sometimes.

Over the past year that Older Children's Life Skills Training Base has been established and operated, all children there have enhanced their self-care ability. Care and encouragement between teachers and children in this past year helped Weiwei to become hardworking, optimistic and confident. As time goes by, it is expected that a better Weiwei will appear at her next life stop.

Our Partners

Establish multi-level partnerships

One of the key elements of the global strategy “ Our Promise 2030 ” of World Vision International is to expand project impact through partnerships and advocacy, and to achieve project outcomes with partners who shared our goals in a better way.

With love and courage, World Vision has worked humbly with different partners, including government departments, civil organizations, enterprises, academic experts, etc. to establish a comprehensive partnership, and effectively mobilize knowledge, expertise, capital and other resources to work together for sustainable development goals and child well-being, caring and helping poor and vulnerable people. At the same time, World Vision has paid great attention to capacity building of social organizations to help social forces provide more professional services for children.



In January 2019, members of the Board of Directors of World Vision China visited local partner to learn about the progress of the cooperative projects.



In 2019, World Vision organized child safety regulations workshops in Guangzhou City and Nanchang City respectively, and supported the professional development of 59 local social organizations in their child work.



In March 2019, the “Beautiful Community Environmental Sanitation and Children’s Health Project” summary meeting was held in Kunming City, Yunnan Province.



The “Seminar on Social Organizations’ Participation in the Construction of the National Child Protection System” was supported by World Vision and with guidance of Guangxi Charity Federation.



In April 2019, the China Foundation for Poverty Alleviation conducted an investigation on poverty alleviation projects and learned about the implementation situation of World Vision's program in Baihe County.



In April 2019, World Vision, Guangxi Charity Federation and Xiangzhou County Civil Affairs Bureau, Jinxiu County Civil Affairs Bureau of Laibin City, Guangxi Province signed a tripartite cooperation agreement to continue the implementation of the child-focused area development program in the two counties.



In July 2019, World Vision and the People's Government of Suide County, Yulin City, Shaanxi Province, signed a cooperation agreement and officially launched the child-focused area development program in Suide County.



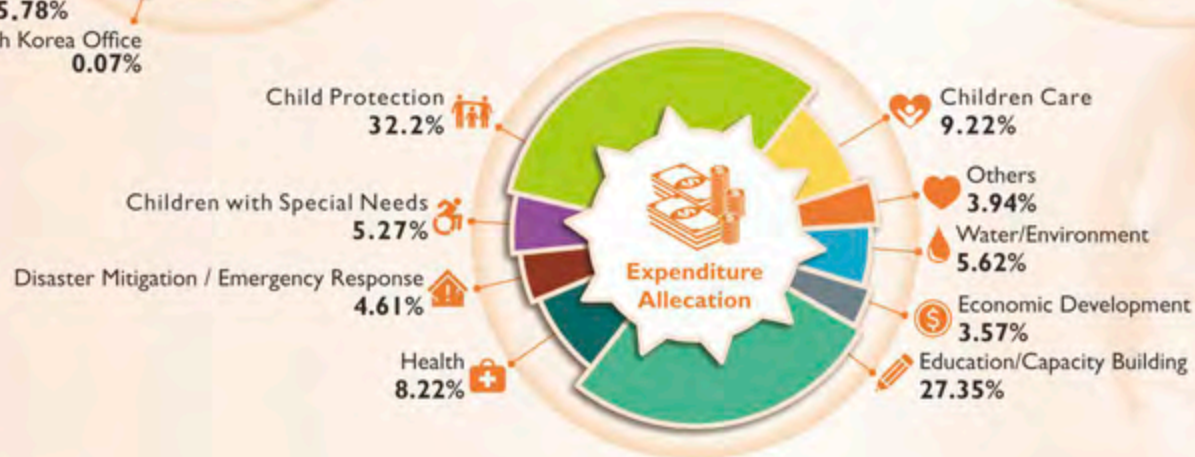
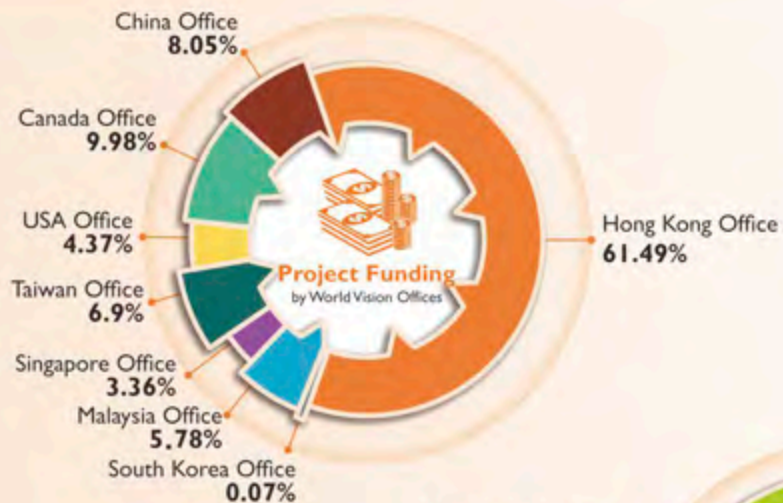
